UTILITY BILLS

You must call to request temporary relief.

Georgia Power	As of March 14, 2020, Georgia Power has temporarily suspended residential disconnections for 30 days and will reevaluate the policy and time frame as the situation develops. This means they are giving customers extra time to pay if they need it. Additionally, they will not disconnect customers' electric
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	service at this time, even if they have not paid bills that are overdue. They will continue to read meters and send bills, so customers are encourage to continue to pay their bill to avoid large balances later.
Atlanta Watershed Management	The Department of Watershed Management is temporarily suspending water disconnections during this time. For assistance with payment arrangements, contact a customer service specialist at 404-546-0311.

EVICCTIONS

- Magistrate Court has suspended all landlord/tenant matters including evictions.
- Pending evictions, that have been scheduled for an eviction, will be discontinued until the court reopens.
- Tenants can still file and answer via E-file.
- Answers are not due until 48 hours AFTER the court lifts the emergency order.
- The court is asking landlords to postpone filing until after court reopens.

- The Mayor has called for a temporary moratorium on residential evictions and filings for a period not to exceed 60 days.
